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## The Label Works

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#### Preface:

The Label Works was designed for the average ADAM user and small business, to create professional looking labels. Four type styles are available, elite, italized, expanded, and compressed, all double striked to make them near letter quality. Clip art pictures can be included with a standard label, they are also double striked to make them look more professional. Spacing between labels can be set in one, two, three, inch and #/72 (1 to 85), of an inch. This will let The Label Works use almost any size label. The work space can hold 200 labels, one clip, and be saved as a file to disk, d.d.p., and ramdisk. A special feature lets you mark files to be printed from the work space, a print all labels from the work space feature, and from the edit label option you can choose to print one label from 1 to 99 times. A custom label option lets you set up a label from one to ten lines with up to 40 characters on a line. This works great for disk labels, large mailing labels, ect. The Label Works is written entirely in Z80 machine code and uses color screens with smartkey displays, and our new SmartDSK operating system. A parallel interface and 9 pin dot matrix printer using Epson codes is required. Optional ramdisk feature requires any size memory expander.

## System Requirements.

A standard ADAM computer System, a TV or monitor, printer interface, and a Epson compatible 9 pin dot matrix printer. This can be any 9 pin printer that uses Epson printer codes.

### **Optional Hardware.**

Memory expander, this will allow the use of the SmartDSK'S ramdisk. Disk Drives for faster data saves and loads.

Getting Started.

1. Make sure your printer is connected to the parallel interface installed in your ADAM.

2. Turn on your ADAM computer accessories, (disk drives, TV, monitor, printer, ect.).

3. Turn on your ADAM computer.

4. Insert The Label Works disk or D.D.P. into one of your drives. (note: the D.D.P. version will only work in tape drive #1.).

5. Pull the computer reset switch toward you.

6. In a few moments the title screen should appear.

7. In a few seconds the Main Menu screen will appear, if not refer to the trouble shooting section of this manual.

8. If the Main Menu screen appeared on your TV or monitor screen, then you are ready to begin.

9. Refer to the section of this manual pertaining to the option you want to use.

#### **Useful Information.**

1. A clip is a small picture, The Label Works can use only the one K version. There are hundreds of clips in the public domain. They are available from almost any user group or retail ADAM store.

2. When you begin The Label Works, remember there isn't a clip in memory, in order to print one with your labels you will need to load a clip file, or a label file that contains a clip. A clip file doesn't have to be in memory to print labels without a clip.

3. When you save a label file you also save the clip in memory. Make sure the clip you want is in memory before saving the label file.

4. The workspace holds 200 labels and one clip. The file will take up 40 blocks on a disk, D.D.P., or the SmartDSK'S ramdisk.

5. The Label Works program contains the SmartDSK operating System. When using the BOS start option from the EXIT menu, make sure the program you are going to boot is compatible with this new O.S. If you are not sure pull the computer reset switch. Most Walters Software programs are compatible, and in SmartDSK III's case it eliminates the need to boot SmartDSK III before SmartBASIC 1 or 2. An Example, insert SmartBASIC into a drive, make sure there isn't any disk/d.d.p's in the other drives, and push smartkey (V). This will boot the SmartBASIC and keep the new operating system in memory.

6. The Label Works doesn't use the memory expander except for a ramdisk. The SmartDSK setup program in the new operating system will check to see if a previous ramdisk exists. If one is found the ramdisk is left intact, if not, then a new one is set up.

7. When marking and erasing marks, with the edit label fuction. To update the label on the screen, push smartkey [VI] to see if the label was marked or erased.

1. Push smartkey [I] to display The Label Works copyright message.

2. Push smartkey [VI] to return to the Main Menu.

## Print Labels.

1. Push smartkey [ II ] to print labels in the workspace. You must first add labels with the add option, or load a file that contains labels.

## #/72 Of An Inch Setting.

1. Push smartkey [ VI ] to set the spacing between labels in (72's) of an inch.

2. Use the up and down arrow keys to select the setting.

3. Push smartkey [V] to enter the setting displayed on the screen.

4. Push smartkey [ VI ] to return the setting to the default of five, and return to the previous menu.

## Print All, Print Marked.

1. Push smartkey [ TV ] to print all the labels in the workspace.

2. Push smartkey [ V ] to print only marked labels.

1. Push smartkey [VI] to stop printing. This feature will only stop printing at the end of a label. You also have the option to continue where you stopped. Printers with large printer buffers will take longer to stop.

3. Push smartkey [ V ] to enter the label into the workspace. Push smartkey [ V ] to enter another label, or smartkey [ VI ] to return to the main menu.

4. Push Smartkey [VI] to clear the label. This will clear the label and return you to the enter print style menu.

1. Push smartkey [ IV ] to exit to SmartWriter.

2. Push smartkey [V] to execute an EOS start. What this does is leaves the new SmartDSK operating system in memory and boot the disk or d.d.p. in the default drive. Example insert SmartBASIC into disk drive one and push smartkey [V], SmartBASIC will boot up with the SmartDSK operating system and have all the smartdsk options including the ramdisk, which is compatable with all Walters Software Co. programs.

3. Push Smartkey [VI] to return to the previous menu, (main menu).

#### Trouble Shooting.

1. Labels not printing correctly. The Label Works is set up for a 9 pin dot matrix printer using Epson printer codes. Most Adam users own these printers. If you have a different printer and would like The Label Works to work with your printer, you may call Walters Software Co. for more information.

2. D.d.p won't boot. Make sure you are using tape drive number one. If the D.d.p. still won't boot contact Walters Software Co. for assistance.

3. Disk won't boot. Try another drive. If the disk still won't boot, contact Walters Software Co. for assistance.

4. Printer won't print. Check your printer and make sure it is turned on, on line, and the labels are inserted correctly.

5. Spacing incorrect between labels. The Label Works default is for standard mailing labels, that are 15/16" long. If you are using different size labels, use the Set Spacing option to adjust the spacing between labels. Printing some labels on paper will help you get the correct spacing, before using your labels.

6. Clip and label files. The Label Works doesn't check file types before loading in a file. You can load any file that is at least one K for a clip file. This will not cause any problems and the file will be displayed on the screen as garbage. Loading a non label will cause problems, it could cause the program to crash. These files are 40 K long. Use a file name that will let you know that a file is for The Label Works.

**Useful Information.** 

Faster scanning of labels in the workspace. Hold down the arrow key for the direction you wish to go, then push the other arrow key, to scan faster.

Escape/WP key. This key can be used to return to the Main Menu from almost any where in The Label Works program.

Backspace key. Use the backspace key to erase the last character typed. Holding is down will continue to erase more characters, until all are erased.

Clips. There are six custom clips included on The Label Works media. Use these to design your own labels, or as ideas in designing your own clips.

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This is Elite Print. *This is Italic Print.*  **This is Expanded Print.** This is Compressed Print.

The (S) is for Elite. The (I) is for Italic. The (E) is for Expanded. The (C) is for Compressed.

The custom label option works great for disk labels, using compresses print.

You can use the EDIT option to enter labels by loading a label file with all empty labels. Edit a label and enter it into the workspace. Save the file if you plan on using the labels again. The EMPTYLW file contained on The Label Works media is intended for this use.
